Delmont Pilgrimage – is a beautiful walk through the birth of Christ portrayed by real actors (and animals) each year sponsored by the churches located in Delmont. The walk begins across from the Salem Lutheran Church, and takes you to the birth of our Savior in a manger. Terry and I have been the last two years and it is beautiful and peaceful. This only happens one weekend, Saturday and Sunday, December 2 & 3 this year. There is then shuttle service between the 5 churches, who each have unique displays and food available for purchase. The Greater Latrobe Ministerial Association – is seeking a part-time Food Pantry and Centralized Assistance Manager to serve vulnerable members of our community through our local food pantry and emergency assistance programs. Ideally, this person could begin work in November of 2023. The Food Pantry and Centralized Assistance Manager is responsible for the day-to-day operations of both the food pantry and emergency assistance programs, along with the coordination of a monthly food distribution. This position entails client intake, volunteer coordination, resource management, and emergency assistance distribution, along with other administrative responsibilities. Most of all, it requires compassion and care for people experiencing difficult circumstances. Vickie has a full job description if you would like to check it out.

Thrivent Action Teams update - The response from eligible members has been wonderful! We are nearing our goal of 100% participation. There is still time to apply for projects. If you have financial products from Thrivent, you may be eligible to apply for up to two \$250 grants that would benefit our church and community. You can apply online or over the phone. It's simple and takes only minutes. If you need some guidance, talk to Pam Yuhaniak.
